After sunset the streets of the city come to life as the famed palm trees brightly glow with thousands of dazzling lights, adding to the festive atmosphere. Large swags of colorful lights extend over Wilshire Boulevard creating a canopy of holiday cheer as shoppers zoom beneath in their Rolls Royces, Bentleys and Volkswagens (some folks are just visiting).

High in the air, suspended above Wilshire Boulevard, a full-sized version of Santa, his sleigh and reindeer herald in the season and beckon to the traffic below that the holidays are here and there's shopping to be done! At least that's what the City tells us he's saying.

Due to the popularity of last season's holiday wrapping of the Beverly Hills Chamber of Commerce building as a colorful present, we are adding two more building wraps to parking structures in town, complete with enormous ribbons and bows.
